SARA FELLINI (playwright, director, AINE LUNA) is an award-winning playwright, director, actress, and skilled artisan. Her play HAZARD A LITTLE DEATH was nominated for six awards at the 2014 Planet Connections Theater Festivity including Best Production of a New Play and Best Lead Actress (Sara Fellini), and won Best New Script. She performed as Nannerl in the monodrama THE OTHER MOZART written by Sylvia Milo at The Players

Theatre in New York City and toured the production through the Southern US (\*winning Cat5 magazine's Best Theater Production of 2015, "the voice of a crystal bell, Fellini is captivating" –NOLA Defender), and created the role of Maeve Shourd in a site-specific production of IN VESTMENTS, a play of her own writing and winner of two NYIT awards, nominated for Outstanding New Full-Length Script, earning her theater company the prestigious Donn Russell grant, and acclaimed by the NY Times as "wrenching and visually eloquent". She has appeared as the titular character in another play of her own writing, THE EXECUTION of MRS. COTTON (called "darkly humorous" and "deliciously ghoulish" by the NY Times) at IRT Theater as part of their 3B Residency, she directed and played Mary Shelley in MARY'S LITTLE MONSTER by Thomas Kee at the Mudlark Public Theater in New Orleans, Davenport Theatre in NYC as part of the Davenport space grant, and upcoming off-broadway at The Players Theatre as part of their Artistic Residency (postponed due to COVID-19 and returning January 2022) after a successful intimate run at Torn Page, the historic home of Rip Torn and Geraldine Page. She played Artemisia Gentileschi in her play NEC SPE / NEC METU at The Tank's July 2017 DarkFest and at Theater Row as part of the United Solo Festival, and Asia Booth Clarke in THE BRUTES ("irresistibly dramatic, legitimately upsetting" - The NYTimes) by Casey Wimpee at The Flamboyan as part of The 10th Anniversary Planet Connections Festivity, nominated for 8 awards including Outstanding Direction and Outstanding Costume Design (both Sara Fellini). THE BRUTES was then specially invited to The Players, the historic club in New York City founded by Edwin Booth, the performance presented by players and members of The Booth family. She is the Artistic Director of theater company spit&vigor and designs costumes and props for various theater companies in and around NYC.

Regionally, Adam has toured and performed as K.Bus in BUTCHER HOLLER HERE WE COME (Cincinnati Fringe Festival 2013, New Orleans Fringe Festival 2013, Out-of-the-Loop Festival 2014-Dallas, Revolutions 2016-Albuquerque, NM, Hollywood Fringe 2019, others), he has worked with MTB productions to produce and star in HELPLESS DOORKNOBS and as The Stranger in MY AIM IS TRUE as part of the New Orleans Fringe, and he portrayed THE ORATOR in Eugene Ionesco's THE CHAIRS (Gorilla Theater, Tampa FL). He's produced for and worked at The 14th Street Y, The Tank, 3LD, The Ohio Theater, The New Ohio Theatre, The Davenport Theater, the Center at West Park, The Abingdon Theater (Dorothy Strelsin and the June Havoc,) American Place Theater, Under St. Marks, and IRT Theater, among others. He is the Executive Producer of Brooklyn based theater company spit&vigor (www.spitnvigor.com).



CHRISTINE Y. KIM (SOFONISBA/IDA LUNIGIANA) is a NYC based Korean-American actor, stand up comedian, sketch writer and performer. Christine's comedy has been described by her peers as "mischievous" "quirky" and "smart". She is well known for her "bummer" factor and not being afraid of the dark. She has been told she has a great deal of flawed logic, but in a GOOD way. If you

come out to shows, you may have seen her in a variety of stand up shows and dark crawl spaces around NYC. She is the co-creator and co-producer of Street Cred Comedy and one half the comedy duo of Cohall & Kim. She was recently part of the Good Karma Comedy Festival. You may have also seen her recently in digital sketches with That Just Happened, live with her indie sketch group Adam's Summer Class or her sketch house team RUNDMV at The PIT. She is also an alumni of Old School Sketch Show. She has studied with The Barrow Group, T. Schreiber, Wynn Handman, The PIT and UCB. The greatest compliment she has received in life is being called a "trailblazer" and has been compared to Meryl Streep. Whatever that means. Christine fell in love with acting and comedy early in life, starring as the lead squirrel in her church's Christmas play, playing the titular role in a digital opera version of Cinderella in junior high, and playing the lead Yun Zhifan in Secret Love in Peach Blossom Land in college. If you don't know her personally, you may have seen her recently in shorts such as Amy in Interracial Supper directed by Laerke Rose or as Data in The Grownies directed by Artie Brennan and Anthony Giordano. If you've been following her for awhile, you may have seen her in The King & I national tour with Raviv Ullman, Jesse McCartney, Hayley Mills, Marie Osmond and Maureen McGovern, possibly having the bubonic plague on NBC's Third Watch, or as a cool rockstar in a Nickelodeon campaign commercial rapping. In collaboration with theater company Theatre4thePeople, spit&vigor was the recipient of the 2015 New York Innovative Theater Outstanding Premiere Production of a Play Award for their very first production, which included an Artist Support Grant from the Donn Russell Fund. spit&vigor has since gone on to earn The Players Theater off-broadway Artistic Residency, The Center at West Park's Artist Residency, IRT's 3B Residency, The Davenport space grant, The Times Center space grant, and a special invitation to The Glitterbox Theater in Pittsburgh and the 2017 NOLA InFringe Festival.

We are NYC-based but our productions have travelled from California to Texas to Louisiana and back to New York City.
